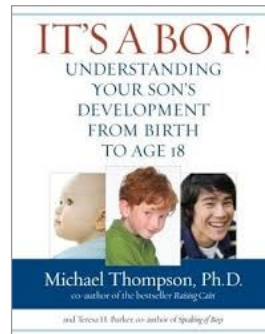


## Dr. Michael Thompson The Nature of Boys
